The NOPBC Conference takes place within the NFB convention. The NOPBC conference, the NFB convention, & NFB Child Care have separate registration fees. SEMINAR DAY INFORMATION-TUESDAY, JULY 1

On Seminar Day, Tues., July 1, adults, children, and youth are invited to start the morning together at the "Taking the Next Step" Seminar. At the end of the general session (10:45 a.m.) children *preregistered with NFB child care* will be escorted to the Music & Movement activity and youth 11-18 will be escorted to the Youth Track activity, while adults attend workshops. At the lunch break, pick up your child from child care for lunch on your own. After lunch there will be workshops for adults, a children's activity in the child care rooms, and a Youth Track activity.
