Lawyers with Disabilities (LWDs) face considerable challenges in the legal profession, from being denied access and accommodations on gateway examinations such as the LSAT and the MCBE, to difficulty obtaining employment because of stereotypes or negative assumptions about the capability of LWDs. Disability, unlike race or gender, is not typically included as a category to which diversity initiatives and recruitment efforts are directed, thereby contributing to the under-reporting of LWDs.
