Experienced Attorneys

Experienced attorneys are being recruited to fill positions within the Office of the Solicitor (SOL) in the San Francisco, CA, Los Angeles, CA and Seattle WA Regional Solicitor’s Offices. We are soliciting resumes for Term, excepted service attorney positions not-to-exceed 3 years at the GS-12 through GS-14 grade levels.

Job Duties:

Positions involve litigation and legal advice, and include the following practice areas:

- Fair Labor Standards Act, Davis Bacon Act, and Service Contract Act
- Mine safety and health
- Occupational safety and health
- Fiduciary provisions of ERISA
- Civil rights and whistleblower protection

Qualifications: To qualify for an attorney position, applicants must possess a professional law degree (LL.B. or J.D.); practicing lawyers in California must be licensed by the State Bar. If selected for Los Angeles or San Francisco, attorneys must be or become member of California Bar. Should you be selected for a position in Seattle, you will be required to be a member in good standing of the bar of a court of general jurisdiction of a state, territory or possession of the U.S.; and have experience conducting federal, state and administrative litigation, which includes developing case strategies; drafting initial pleadings and motions; conducting written discovery and deposition practice; and preparing for and appearing at hearings and trials.
