Certificate of Legal Blindness

The Department of Rehabilitation Services - BESB is empowered by statute to maintain a register of legally blind persons in the state of Connecticut. Under provisions of chapter 174 of the General Statutes calling for compulsory reporting of blind persons to the Department of Rehabilitation Services - BESB,

"A person is legally blind if such person's central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with correcting lenses, or if such person's visual acuity is greater than 20/200 but is accompanied by a limitation in the fields of vision such that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than twenty degrees."

According to the medical data and other information on file with this agency,

was certified as legally blind on 08/16/2004 and is, therefore, entitled to all of the benefits available under federal, state, or municipal laws or regulations.
