The Department of Rehabilitation Services, Bureau of Education and Services for the Blind, is presently accepting applications to fill one (1) Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor (Blind) position for the Vocational Rehabilitation (Blind) Program. The successful candidate will have experience with job placement for people who are blind and hold a certification as a Rehabilitation Counselor. We prefer that the selected candidate be fluent in Spanish.

**Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**

Knowledge of principles and techniques of vocational rehabilitation counseling, interviewing and psychological and occupational testing; knowledge of community resources available to rehabilitate visually handicapped persons; knowledge of occupations, job requirements and safety factors; knowledge of medical and psychological aspects of disabilities; considerable interpersonal skills; considerable oral and written communication skills.

**General Experience:**

**Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor (Blind):** A Master's degree in rehabilitation counseling or a closely related field and one (1) year of professional experience in rehabilitation counseling, job placement of persons with disabilities or vocational adjustment counseling.

**Vocational Rehabilitation Assistant Counselor (Blind):** A Bachelor's degree in rehabilitation counseling, psychology, education or related behavioral Science and one (1) year of professional experience in rehabilitation counseling, job placement with disabilities or vocational adjustment counseling.
