Description: The Wellness Coordinator works closely with residents of Friedman Place – all of whom are blind and have a range of health problems - with responsibilities including scheduling doctor and other health-related appointments, arranging and (periodically) providing transportation to and from appointments, supporting the selection of insurance plans and certain public entitlements, etc. The Coordinator will work 20 hours per week with the specific work schedule being flexible and negotiable, but between Mondays – Fridays 9:00am – 5:00pm.

Compensation: \$14 - \$16 per hour, depending on skills and experience. For this parttime position Friedman Place provides 10 paid days off per year – plus paid holidays when they fall on a scheduled work day – starting immediately.

- Two years' experience in an organization providing general clerical support
- Experience as a Patient Navigator, Processor of Public Entitlements, Physician's or billing Clerk, or in a related medical-setting, a plus.
