



Defining the Need



Falls and fall-related injuries are highly prevalent but are preventable

Burden of equipment cost, lack of insurance coverage, delays in receiving equipment

DME can improve mobility, reduce falls, and increase independence

Unneeded durable medical equipment is often thrown away



OFFERING THE SOLUTION

Improve mobility and quality of life for Maryland residents









Divert equipment from landfills, resulting in a positive impact on the environment

- Donations collected, repaired, sanitized, stored, and redistributed from this site





Certified technicians make necessary repairs


NO WASTE

Mock Bedroom and Bathroom

- Train on device in a safe environment before taking it home
- Make sure equipment is the right fit

- Videos on how to use equipment are made available
- Direction on how to maintain and make minor adjustments if needed







Maryland Durable Medical Equipment Re-Use **Distribution and Collection Site Locations**
