Emergency Homework Toolbag

Presenter: Melinda Demaris, TVI Wicomico Co. Public Schools

For those days when the calculator is left at school, the teacher forgot to assignment, modify the assignment just doesn't quite fit, this session will offer some free tips and tools for parents to turn to for help. including how to access free screen readers, talking calculators, recorded stories, and environmental sounds online; how to get your Windows computer to talk; and creative ways to use materials from around the house for tactile art and social studies assignments.

Accessible Devices & Software Options

Presenter: Joshua Irzyk, TVI The MD School for the Blind

With the rapid increase in the amount and easy availability of accessible reading materials, students who are blind or visually impaired now have the capability to obtain reading materials in large print, Braille, and audio in a way that was not possible just five years ago. This session will focus on the devices and software options which use the DAISY format for accessible talking books by providing an overview of currently available software and hardware options.

Finding Wheels: Experiences of a Non-Driver

Presenter: Martin R. Monson, Ed.D., Director of Education, MSB

This session will focus on transportation and ways in which people who do not drive can get to where they want to go, when they want to go there. Tips and real life experiences will be shared.

DIRECTIONS

From the Northeast: Take 95 south to 695 West heading towards Towson. Take Exit 32 (Rt. 1 South) onto Belair Rd. Follow Belair Rd. to Taylor Avenue. Make a right onto Taylor and travel approx. 1 mile. The entrance to the school will be on your left.

From Northwest: Take Rt. 83 south to 695 East. Take Exit 31 for Harford Rd. Go south on Harford Rd. and follow it to Taylor Avenue. Make a left onto Taylor. The entrance to the school is about 200 yards on the right.

From South of Baltimore City: Take either 895 or 95 north through the tunnels. Take Exit 695 West towards Towson. Take Exit 32 for Belair Rd. (Rt. 1 South). Follow Belair Rd., then turn right onto Taylor Avenue. The entrance to the school will be on your left.

From Baltimore City: Take either Perring Parkway or Harford Rd North. Turn right at Taylor Avenue and proceed through several traffic lights. The entrance to the school will be on your right about 200 yards after the intersection of Moyer Ave.
