- Oversee New York State and foundation grants; prepare annual progress reports and final reports
- ➤ Oversee various VI-specific scholarships

Requirements: Master's Degree required; doctorate or matriculation in a doctoral program preferred. TVI certification with a minimum of 3 years of direct service provision as a TVI. Must demonstrate evidence of professional writing ability, be technologically proficient and work well on teams. Experience in higher education and knowledge of the needs of students with multiple impairments are critical. Grant writing skills are necessary.
