WHEREAS, glaucoma is a "sneak thief of sight," with the most common form of glaucoma estimated to affect two to three percent of persons who are 40 and older; and

WHEREAS, glaucoma is significantly more prevalent in Hispanics, African Americans, Native Americans, and Asians; and

WHEREAS, people who have a family history of glaucoma, have diabetes, or are over sixty are at greater risk of glaucoma; and

WHEREAS, glaucoma can be detected through a comprehensive eye exam, and once detected, it can be successfully treated; and

WHEREAS, the coronavirus pandemic has added a level of difficulty for many people to receivce necessary eye screenings and follow up exams,

WHEREAS, it is important for New Mexicans to be aware of the devastating impact of glaucoma and of the benefit of comprehensive eye exams:
