NFB OF UTAH WELCOMES OUR 2022 CONVENTION HONORED GUESTS

NFB NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE: JOHN G. PARÉ JR.

- Mr. Paré is the executive director for Advocacy and Policy at the National Federation of the Blind. In this position he oversees the NFB-NEWSLINE® program, the largest electronic newspaper service in the world, the Independence Market, and the Federation's Governmental Affairs office. He has testified before the House of Representatives Committee on Appropriations Legislative Branch Subcommittee regarding library services for blind Americans.
- He has worked with Federation members on the passage of the Pedestrian Safety Enhancement Act, the Marrakesh Treaty Implementation Act, and many other bills currently moving through Congress.
- He has helped organize educational protests regarding the danger posed by silent electric vehicles, sub-minimum wages for people with disabilities, and the protection of the American with Disabilities Act.
- He has also appeared on CNN, Fox, BBC, and various radio programs to discuss issues affecting blind Americans.
- He loves to walk and is constantly striving to set a new personal record for steps walked in one day.

NFB DISTINGUISHED SPEAKERS: PEGGY AND CURTIS CHONG

Peggy is actively working to preserve the history of the blind of Colorado. For more than three decades, Peggy has been gathering information, stories, lists, news articles, books and more concerning the blind. For the past ten years, she has been analyzing and then re-researching the subject. The facts and stories have become enlightening, surprising and inspiring for everyone. Such a rich history we (the blind), in the United States have been left by blind people whose stories have rarely been told. Their lives have changed the lives of each American and we did not even know it.

While Chong has held significant positions in the corporate sector-namely, a 17-year career as programmer analyst, team coordinator, and designer and consultant, it was his work with the National Federation of the Blind (NFB) that propelled the organization into the modern century of technology innovation. In 1997, he became the Director of Technology in NFB's International Braille and Technology Center in Baltimore, Maryland. With his guidance and oversight, the NFB was able to expand NFB NEWSLINE to a nationally based service with a toll-free number. Curtis is passionate about encouraging other people who are blind to pursue computer careers and making the right tools available to people who are blind to do whatever jobs they choose to do.
