Our Camp for Children Who are Blind or Have Low Vision — the first-ever day camp of its kind in Brooklyn — will operate at our Bay Ridge location (114 White Ave, Brooklyn, NY 11252- Fort Hamilton Army Base) from August 7th—18th.

In our Camp for children who are Blind or have Low Vision, you will become a part of our official Volunteer Squad as well as have the opportunity to participate in something that has never been done in Brooklyn before.

With your volunteer efforts, you will help change the lives of those that have never experienced a typical Summer Camp before. During Summer Camp, volunteers will assist campers in navigating unfamiliar environments; managing belongings; encouraging campers to learn new skills and have fun every day, and more! Upon completing a 1-week minimum of Volunteerism within the Camp for children who are Blind or have Low Vision, you will be provided with an official letter stating your hours completed as well as listing your responsibilities within the camp.

Responsibilities:

Volunteers are expected to utilize the training received at orientation (dates TBD) to support the social-emotional development of the children enrolled in the program. This includes not only assisting the counselors with monitoring the campers but being constantly, and actively engaged in the activities and events. In addition, volunteers are expected to encourage campers to master independent living skills, based on their individual needs and abilities. Volunteers will act as human guides for the children helping them to navigate the campgrounds and items; personal and activity based.
