Why a 6K? Literacy is the fundamental building block for success, and Braille is the primary literacy tool used by blind people. Braille is a raised dot reading and writing medium, where one Braille cell is composed of six dots. Unfortunately, less than 10% of blind youth are taught Braille. Our 6K Dot Dash is symbolic and is representative of our commitment toward ensuring that blind students are taught the fundamental building blocks that are essential for their success, Braille.
