## Budget recommendation will include \$30 million request for Flint water bill repayments



When Governor Rick Snyder presents his budget recommendation next Wednesday, Feb. 10, he will include a \$30 million request for the residents of Flint to keep their water service on and eliminate the need to pay for water they cannot completely trust to drink.

Under the governor's ask, the funding would enable the city of Flint to apply credits for customers on future bills. Estimates show water is roughly 47 percent of billing and sewer costs are around 53 percent. The credit would be applied to consumption usage (roughly 65 percent) of a resident's water portion of the bill, such as for bathing, drinking, cooking, and washing your hands. Residents still would be responsible for paying the sewer portion of their water bills.

Professor Marc Edwards of Virginia Tech said, "This essentially refunds all the money associated with consumption or consumer use. I think it's an amazing gesture of common sense and good will

and it corrects an injustice. I don't think there's a precedent for this. I feel so encouraged by the direction this is going."
