- Develop positive attitudes about blindness



### **Requirements for LIFE**

- At least 14 years old and
- Returning to high school in the fall of 2015
- Have an open case with the Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired (DBVI)
- Actively participate in all five weeks of the program
- Participate in a program that is group structured
- Be able to take care of his/her own personal care needs
- Have a valid State of Virginia ID card

Working part-time in a community-based setting during the last two weeks of LIFE. \*\* In some instances staff will recommend that a student continue to focus on blindness skills (Travel, Braille, Access Technology, and Cooking) during the last two weeks of the program.

## What is the application process for LIFE?

- Contact Daniel Ashman, (804) 371-3339, or daniel.ashman@dbvi.virginia.gov, who will assist you with contacting the student's Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Counselor, and beginning the application process.
- VR Counselor submits a **complete** application packet to the Center by June 5, 2015, or until the program is full.
- Student and parent participate in a phone interview with VRCBVI staff.
- After the completed application has been reviewed, the
  VR Counselor and parents are notified within one week
  whether the applicant is accepted. Hurry! Only twentytwo participants will be accepted into the program.
  Applicants accepted after the program is full will be
  placed on a waiting list.
