

What is LEAP?

- 5 week collaborative program with the Virginia Commonwealth University
- Give rising high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to assess their college readiness skills
- Classes will be taught by college professors and/or graduate students
- Classes will be graded according to collegiate standards (not reflected on transcript)
- Enhance awareness of the academic and blindness-related demands of college
- Evaluate ability to manage time and priorities
- Must have 6 accepted applicants

Dates to remember for LEAP

- Application Deadline: April 17, 2015, or until program is full
- Program Begins: 1:00 p.m., July 12, 2015
- Graduation Ceremony: 2:00-5:00 p.m., August 13, 2015 (MCV Campus)
- Students have to be off the VRCBVI Campus no later than 12:00 p.m., August 14, 2015

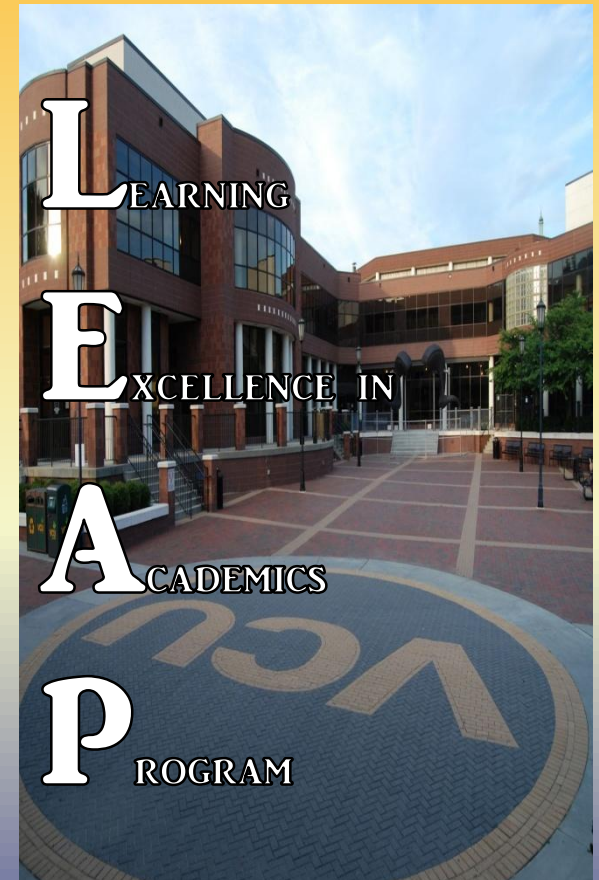

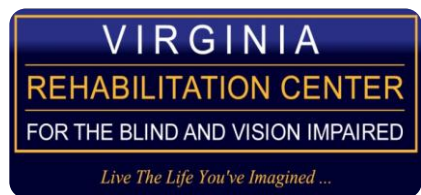

What is the application process for LEAP?

- Contact Daniel Ashman, (804) 371-3339, or daniel.ashman@dbvi.virginia.gov, who will assist you with contacting the student's Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Counselor, and beginning the application process.
- Counselor submits a **completed** application packet to VRCBVI by April 17, 2015 which includes:
 1. Completed VRCBVI application
 2. Documented GPA of 2.5 or above
 3. Personal Statement (500 words or less)
 4. 2 letters of reference (one academic reference)
- After the **completed** application has been reviewed, the VR Counselor and parents are notified within two weeks whether the applicant is accepted. Hurry! Applications accepted on a first come basis until program reaches capacity of fifteen students. Applicants accepted after the program is full will be placed on a waiting list.



Requirements for LEAP

- Have an open case with the Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired ("DBVI")
- Be a rising junior or senior in high school
- Have access to an existing E-mail account (Gmail, Yahoo, AOL, etc.)
- Have a method for and be prepared to take written notes during class
- Be able to participate in a full five-week program
- Be able to participate in a program that is group structured
- Be able to take care of his/her own personal care needs
- Have a valid state of Virginia ID card
