The Rehabilitation Counselor assists individuals with disabilities to increase their vocational, personal, and financial independence by providing vocational counseling and guidance. This position partners with the individual to develop an employment plan that includes the steps needed to obtain and maintain employment and achieve their career goals. This position will provide and coordinate intensive and necessary services for youth and adults.

This position requires regional travel up to five (5) days per week, to meet with participants in the community, area businesses, schools, and other partner organizations. Occasional travel is necessary to attend meetings or trainings in other areas of the state.

This position is <u>telework</u> eligible. Staff are provided with the tools and equipment to be successful in a virtual work environment. Please note, the telework policy could change with notice based on business needs.
